

EXPECTATIONS & REQUIREMENTS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS OF TCSS REMOTE LEARNERS EFFECTIVE 10.16.2020

A remote learner has until Friday, October 30 to return to on-campus learning. After that date, the student is required to remain a remote learner until the end of the second nine weeks.

Complete Remote Learner Orientation with your student on the first day of the nine weeks. This is required for all remote learners and parents/guardians. This will be a virtual orientation session and can be completed at any time in the regular school day on October 16. More details on the orientation will be provided by TCSS prior to October 16.

In addition to the items in this document, parents/guardians should be aware of all information in the document titled **Expectations & Requirements for TCSS Remote Learners**.

Establish a school schedule during the hours of 8 am to 3 pm for your student.

Set up a remote learning area away from distractions for your student.

Do not complete tests/assignments for your student.

When emailing for help, follow the guidelines established in the **Expectations & Requirements for TCSS Remote Learners** document.

For accountability and appropriate course progression in a nine-week course, students are required to maintain current course progression as measured by the completion of weekly assignments, quizzes, and/or tests, as outlined in the course pacing guidelines. This means that students are required to work in Edgenunity (and possibly Schoology) daily in each of their courses/subjects.

If a student falls more than 20 percent behind or has a failing grade in a course at any time, the student and the parent/guardian will be required to attend a conference with the remote learning coach and the administrator, to make a plan to get back on task or return to campus.

If a student falls more than 30 percent behind, they will be required to return to campus as an on-campus learner. If they do not return, the student and parent/guardian will be reported as truant, and related legal procedures will be followed.
