- Keep in close contact with parents concerning child's progress, strengths and weakness

### **Parents**

- Making sure your child attends school daily
- Participation in the monthly Parent Learning Communities
- Having close contact with your child's teacher concerning progress, strengths and weaknesses
- Monitor Leadership Binder daily
- Ensure that your child is reading or is read to at least 20 minutes each night and have a discussion about what is read
